## Maintenance Corner

Your garbage disposal is not a trash can!

Corn husks and other high-fiber items shouldn't be put into the disposal as they may clog the drain. No expandable foods, such as rice or noodles and don't put fat of any kind down your disposal. To be rid of liquid fats or grease store them in an empty can in the fridge and then put them in your trash can.

Don't put metal, plastic, or anything harder than most household foods. No bones! Don't put foreign chemicals into your system.

Run coffee grinds or fill it up with ice and run a dry cycle once a month to aid and sharpen the teeth. To keep from burning the motor, always run cold water before, during, and after usage of your disposal. If your disposal is suddenly without power, reset it by pushing in the red button on the motor housing. Run the disposal after draining the dish water.

If you flip the switch and it just hums, Call maintenance hotline at 478-929-3142 or place a work order through RentCafe.

Garbage disposal are dangerous. Keep your hands far from moving parts. Keep it clean by pouring a little dish soap inside and letting it run for a minute or so with cold water. Toss some citrus peels in once in a while to keep the disposal smelling good.

## Trivia Whiz

### Pass the Pecans, Please

Pecan pie is a popular dessert this time of year. Did you know that about 78 pecans are used in the average pecan pie? Here are some more particulars about pecans:

- The pecan is a species of hickory and native to south-central North America.
- Pecan is from an Algonquian word used to describe nuts requiring a stone to crack.
- A pecan tree yields 25 to 45 pounds of nuts. It is an alternate-bearing tree, producing one crop every two years.
- There are more than 1,000 varieties of pecans, and many are named for native tribes, including Cheyenne, Mohawk, Sioux, Choctaw and Pawnee.
- The United States grows more than 80 percent of the world's pecans.
- Texas and Georgia are the largest producers of commercial pecans. The city of Albany, GA., with more than 600,000 pecan trees, is called the Pecan Capital of the U.S.
- The fats found in pecans are mono-unsaturated and considered heart-healthy. The nuts also contain more than 19 vitamins and minerals, and 1 ounce of pecans provides 10 percent of the recommended daily fiber intake.
- Some of the health benefits of eating pecans include a reduced risk of hypertension, diabetes and cancer.
- Pecan wood is used in baseball bats, tool handles, furniture, wall paneling and flooring. In 1995, Georgia pecan wood was selected to make the handles of the Olympic torches for the 1996 Summer Games.
