## Winter Tips & Tricks

Ever notice the small switch on the side of your ceiling fan? Most people haven't, much less given a second thought as to what is does. Flip that switch and you'll change the rotation of your fan to pull air upwards rather than push it down into the room. One of the best ways to help keep that warm air and in cold air out, is to invest in insulated curtains. When purchasing an artificial tree, look for the label Fire-Retardant. Although this label does not mean the tree won't catch fire, it does indicate the tree will resist burning and should extinguish quickly. When setting up a tree at home, place it away from fireplaces, radiators, portable heaters, heater vents, and TV sets.

## **Maintenance Corner**

#### **Dishwasher Tips (Maintenance and Care)**

Use your Dishwasher regularly. If you notice a bad odor, run a cup of white vinegar in empty dishwasher for an entire cycle. Scrape dishes off before putting them in the dishwasher, but it's not necessary to rinse, it wastes water. Choose the correct wash cycle. Shorter is not necessarily better. Load the dirtiest items in the lower basket. Don't use a detergent that has a rinse aid in it and also put liquid rinse aid in the dispenser. Don't overload or improperly load your dishwasher. Water and soap must flow freely over and between items. Clean the filter located near the bottom of the dishwasher. Run hot water through the faucet nearest the dishwasher just before running the dishwasher. Let your dishes air dry, either by using the automatic switch or turning the dishwasher off after final rinse and opening the door slightly. If your dishwasher stops working or leaks, call the maintenance hotline at 478-929-3142 or place a work order through RentCafé.

## **Fun Facts About Christmas**

- Christmas is celebrated as the birthday of Jesus. The 25th day of December was chosen to mark His birthday by the Roman Catholic Church years after His death.
- One of the reasons Santa can make his marathon runs through the day is due to the help of his trusted elven workforce.
- Jingle Bells was written for Thanksgiving, not Christmas. The song was written in 1857 by James Lord Pierpont and published under the title One Horse Open Sleigh. It was supposed to be played in the composer's Sunday school class during Thanksgiving as a way to commemorate the famed Medford sleigh races.
- Jingle Bells was also the first song to be broadcast from space.
- The First artificial Christmas Tree wasn't a tree at all. It was created out of goose feathers that were dyed green. The first artificial Christmas trees were developed in Germany in the 19th century, due to a major continuous deforestation. The feather trees became increasingly popular during the early 20th century and finally made their way to the US.
- In 1836 Alabama became the first U.S. states to recognize Christmas as an official holiday.
- The real St. Nicholas lived in Turkey where he was a bishop in the early 4th century.
- The Dutch turned the bishop into a Christmas gift-giving person with a gut. When Dutch settlers migrated to the U.S. they brought the St. Nick tradition with them. Eventually, he became known as Santa Claus.
- Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer was actually created by department store Montgomery Ward in the late 1930s for a holiday promotion.
- The poinsettia plant was brought into the United States from Mexico by Joel Poinsett in the early 1800s.
