Over the past year, we have been working diligently to rebuild your trust, by doing some "big things", such as adopting the "Hunt Standard" for resident-initiated service requests and rolling out a mobile application for

Maintenance Corner

We would like to remind you of our refuse collection rules. Kitchen waste must be securely wrapped prior to placement in the refuse container. Areas around refuse container must be maintained in high state of cleanliness at all time. Refuse containers must be placed on the front of the street on the day of collection no later than 7:00 am and returned to storage area as soon as possible after being dumped on the same day of collection. Refuse receptacles must be maintained in clean and functional state at all the time. Refuse receptacle must be kept in the rear of the quarters unless a designated area exists. Receptacles will be maintained out of the public view. Refuse receptacles will be replaced by Waste Industries (478-328-1080) when they become unserviceable. Domestic refuse that exceeds the capacity of the refuse container may be bagged and placed next to the container for removal. All excess refuse must be in a plastic bag for removal

Fun Facts About New Year's

As we're about to ring in the New Year, here are some facts about New Year's Eve to explain some of your existing traditions, and maybe inspire you to try some new ones! The earliest known New Year celebrations were in Mesopotamia and date back to 2000 B.C. January is named after Janus, the God with two faces, one looking forward and one looking backward. He is the God of beginnings, transitions, gates, doors, passages, and endings. Ancient Persians gave New Year's gifts of eggs, which symbolized productiveness. Black eyed peas, ham and cabbage are considering good luck if you eat them on New Year's Eve or Day because it is believed they will bring you money. Lobster and chicken are considering bad luck because lobsters can move backward and chickens can scratch in reverse, so it is thought these foods could bring a reversal of fortune.
