Independence Day

In a couple of days we will be celebrating Independence Day. Across America, people will be celebrating with fireworks, parades, barbecues and other festivities. Here is some facts you can share with your friends and family.

1. The Declaration of Independence began on July 2, 1776. It started with a letter to Britain's King George to explain why the Continental Congress voted to declare America's independence.
2. Thomas Jefferson drafted the Declaration of Independence, and on July 4th the final wording of the declaration was agreed.
3. Jefferson later served as the third President of America from 1801 to 1809 and coincidentally died on July 4, 1826.
4. The stars on the original American flag were in the circle so all Colonies would appear equal.
5. The White House celebrated Independence Day for the first time in 1801.
6. Almost 100 years after the Declaration of Independence, in 1870, July 4 was made an official holiday by Congress.
7. Benjamin Franklin proposed the turkey as the national bird but he was overruled by John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, who recommended the bald eagle.
8. The Peachtree Road Race in Atlanta, GA is a 10K running race held every year on July 4th.
9. Each year there is a famous hot dog eating contest at Coney Island, New York. Around 410,000 people show up to watch and millions watch on TV. In 2011 the winner was Joey Chestnut who ate 62 hot dogs in ten minutes.

Maintenance Corner

Dear residents,

With the hot weather upon us, we would like you to pay close attention to your heat/AC registers/vent for any discoloration. The cold air coming out, hitting the warmer air causes condensation. You may notice water droplets at first, but combined with the dust in the air can form darker color or streaks around the vents. A simple wipe every couple weeks will prevent this discoloration from taking place, which could limit the disruption to your lives if this interrupts your service. Please stay safe, enjoy the summer, and thank you for being our residents.
