A Few Safety Notes

Ever notice the small switch on the side of your ceiling fan? Most people haven't much less give a second thought as to what it does. Flip that switch and you'll change the rotation of your fan to pull air upwards rather than push it down into the room. One of the best ways to help keep that warm air and the cold air out, is to invest in insulated curtains. When purchasing an artificial tree, look for the label "Fire-Retardant". (Although this label does not mean the tree won't catch fire, it does indicate the tree will resist burning and should extinguish quickly.) When setting up a tree at home, place it away from fireplaces, radiators, portable heaters, heater vents, and TV sets.

Quick Cooks Recipe

Chocolate Chip Cookies

INGREDIENTS

40 saltines
1 cup butter, cubed
3/4 cup sugar
2 cups semisweet chocolate chips
1 package (8 ounces) milk chocolate English toffee bits

DIRECTIONS

Line a 15" x 10" x 1" baking pan with heavy-duty foil. Arrange saltines in a single layer on foil; set aside. In a large heavy saucepan over medium heat, melt butter. Stir in sugar. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 1-2 minutes or until sugar is dissolved. Pour evenly over crackers. Bake at 350° for 8-10 minutes or until bubbly. Immediately sprinkle with chocolate chips. Allow chips to soften for a few minutes, then spread over top. Sprinkle with toffee bits. Cool. Cover and refrigerate for 1 hour or until set. Break into pieces. Store in an airtight container.

The Nutcracker (Online Virtual Event)

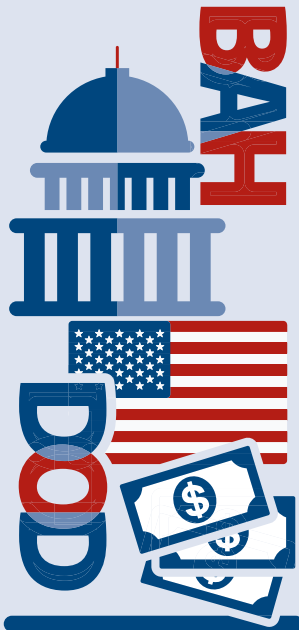
The 24th annual production directed by Amelia Pelton. It is from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm. Please call 478-445-4226 for more information. The admission is free.

WHERE DOES YOUR BAH WITH HUNT MILITARY COMMUNITIES GO?

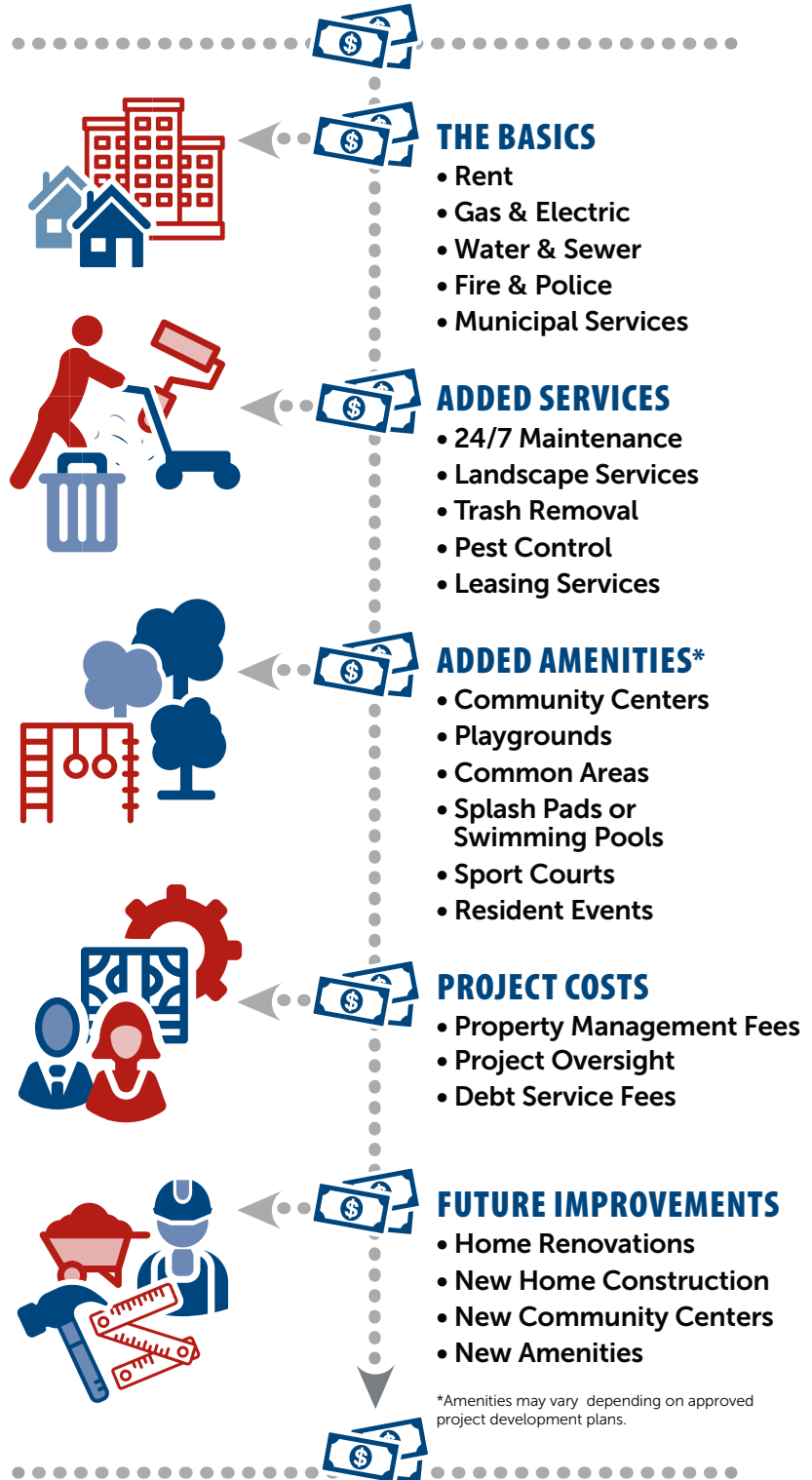


Your Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) is the stipend the Department of Defense allocates for you to pay for the majority of rent and utilities.
